

We are advocates of family choice and help the family identify a vision for the future, utilizing natural supports and community resources to develop strength-based strategies.

Our role is to partner with the family team, empowering parents to be in the driver's seat of their children's services.


We will help the family identify potential crisis situations and work with them to develop a comprehensive safety plan.

Wraparound is a team-based process that helps groups of people involved in your family's life work together toward a common goal.

The process is organized and delivered by someone who is trained to facilitate the team.

The team creates a plan that includes ways to assure that children/youth and their families can experience success in their communities, homes, and schools.

What to Expect

- You will be asked to help develop a team and make decisions with that team
- You will be asked to identify your family's strengths and needs
- You and your team will consider a variety of actions to meet needs
- You and your team will evaluate whether your plan is getting the results you want
- We will meet at a time and place that is convenient for you
