1. Welcome and Roll Call

Michele Missel called the meeting to order at 9:02AM
It was noted that there wasn't a quorum as there were only 4 members present

2. Approval of Meeting Minutes from August 5, 2020 BHAC

The meeting minutes were reviewed, with no concerns, but not approved, as there wasn't a quorum present so the minutes will be approved at the November 4, 2020 meeting

3. Approval of Agenda

The agenda was reviewed, with no concerns, but could not be approved as there wasn't a quorum present

4. Nurturing Healthy Behaviors – Melissa Schaefer

Melissa gave a PowerPoint presentation, with a print out of the same included in the member's packets

- a. Review of Plan and Budget
 - i. Maintain high quality service provision including positive child outcomes
 - ii. Strategies for parent involvement
 - iii. Targeted marketing
- b. Recommendation to Governing Board

- i. There wasn't a quorum present, so the Committee was unable to take a vote
- ii. Melissa will present the plan and budget to the Governing Board at the September 9, 2020 meeting, for their approval

5. Year 3 Strategic Prevention Framework (SPF)-Partnership for Success (PFS) – Crystal Fuller

- a. Review of Plan and Budget
 - i. This is year 3 of the 5-year grant
 - ii. Crystal gave an overview of the plan and budget
 - iii. Handouts were included everyone's packets detailing the plan and budget
- b. Recommendation to Governing Board
 - i. There wasn't a quorum present, so the Committee was unable to take a vote
 - ii. Crystal will present the plan and budget to the Governing Board at the September 9, 2020 meeting, for their approval

6. Update on Mental Health Anti-Stigma Campaign – Crystal Fuller

Crystal gave a PowerPoint presentation, with a print out of the same included in the member's packets

- a. Wellcom and Wellcare have combined and have become The Wellbeing Partners
- b. Crystal shared that there are 5 collaborating partners with a target audience of persons in Pottawattamie, Douglas, Sarpy and Cass counties
- c. Chris Kelly asked why zip codes are an identifier in Douglas county and Crystal replied that those areas indicated a higher need for mental health services
- d. Michele asked who writes the synopsis for the Spokesimals for the website and Crystal replied that the campaign drafts the narrative of what the pet owner shares
- e. Chris then asked how a person can have a profile in the "What Makes Us" platform and Crystal answered that they would go to the site and share their testimonial

7. Update on SAMHSA Emergency Grant (SEG) – Miles Glasgow

Miles shared a PowerPoint of which a printout was also included in the member's packets

- a. This grant is to address Mental Health and Substance Use treatment for individuals seeking behavioral health services in relation to COVID-19
- b. The target population is adults in Nebraska who meet DBH financial eligibility requirements
- c. Seven providers will provide services in all 5 counties

8. Network Services Update – Taren Petersen

Updates were included in the packets for everyone's review.

- a. Taren highlighted the upcoming trainings
- b. She also shared that the RSP phase of the CCP grant was awarded to Region 6

9. Status Reports for Period Ending July 31, 2020

Reports were included in the packets for everyone's review

- a. Taren gave an update of the July, 2020 Contract Status Reports stating that it is too early to really see any trends
- b. Taren gave an update of the July, 2020 Mobile Crisis Response Report
 - i. Post-crisis services were used by 63 individuals
- c. Taren gave an update of the July, 2020 Emergency Protective Custody Report
 - i. The EPC numbers are lower this year as compared to last year, it seems to be trending down

- ii. Miles asked for feedback on the new form, and Committee members stated that they liked the new version of the report as it has better visualization and they also like the comparisons, although the yellow printing is difficult to read
- d. Taren gave an update of the July, 2020 Acute and Subacute Occupancy Rates report
 - i. Douglas County has some closed beds, but will be fully opened soon
 - ii. Taren asked if this is a report that the members would like to continue receiving and if it is helpful and Rob replied that, yes, he appreciates the report
 - iii. Taren also stated that if there is any other data that they would like to receive, to please reach out to her
